

#### About the Izaak Walton League of America

At the turn of the 20th century, uncontrolled discharges of industrial waste and raw sewage, unrestricted logging, and soil erosion threatened to destroy the nation's most productive waterways. The country's forests, wetlands, and wilderness areas were quickly disappearing. In 1922, 54 sportsmen declared that it was "time to call a halt" to this destruction. Aware that action – not just talk – would be necessary to solve these problems, the group decided to form an organization to combat water pollution and protect the country's woods and wildlife. As a reminder of their purpose, they named the organization after Izaak Walton, the 17th-century angler-conservationist who wrote the literary classic, *The Compleat Angler*.



IWLA National Chapters

The Izaak Walton League of America soon became the nation's preeminent organization of hunters, anglers, and outdoor enthusiasts dedicated to sustainable use of our country's natural resources. Today, the League's more than 42,000 members and 230 community-based chapters are building on the accomplishments of those who preceded them as defenders of the nation's soil, air, woods, waters, and wildlife and champions of outdoor recreation opportunities for all Americans. #### IWLA National Convention

The event, which is the largest annual gathering of "Ikes" (as League members are known), moves to a new location each year and this year will be hosted by the Ohio Division in Sandusky. Chartered in 1922, the Ohio Division of the Izaak Walton League of America was formed to assist, compliment, and support local chapters, providing leadership in conservation and outdoor recreation in Ohio.

The Division's annual State Convention is held in May. This meeting is used for regular business and to prepare chapter and Division resolutions and awards submissions for discussion and action at the National Convention.

### Statewide Chapters

Over the past 95 years, Ohio chapters of the Izaak Walton League have helped thousands of people develop a greater appreciation for Ohio's natural resources and learn ways to help care for Ohio's future through hands-on, grassroots activities.

Archery, shooting sports, fishing derbies, hiking, and boating are some of the many recreation activities organized by our chapters. Members are also leading local conservation efforts by monitoring water quality in local streams, hosting roadside litter clean-ups, native tree plantings, and more. The Division has guided statewide initiatives for clean water and Great Lakes conservation, farmland preservation, and programs to provide sportsmen and women access to private lands.

The Division also supports local chapters by drawing on a wide base of experts to guide League efforts. Every chapter member in Ohio is a member of the Division. Regular Division meetings are held in the fall and winter.

Today, the Izaak Walton League boasts 24 chapters throughout the state and over 2,000 active members. ## Engaging Youth in the Outdoors

**Getting people – especially kids – active outside is the first step on a longer road to conserving our air, water and other natural resources.**

America's natural resources are facing serious and growing threats at a time when iPhones, Xboxes, and other electronic devices are more fashionable than fishing at a local stream, participating in shooting sports such as archery, or even going for a hike. With 230 chapters around the country, League members are playing an active role in connecting new generations of kids with conservation and outdoor recreation. We recognize that today's young people are tomorrow's conservationists and the League is working in Ohio and around the country to help kids grow up with a personal connection to nature by:

- Offering a wide array outdoor recreation experiences such as archery clinics, fishing derby events, hunter safety training programs, hiking, and camping.
- Facilitate “Young Ikes” and “Tiny Ikes” programs that offer age appropriate activities designed to help children understand the natural world and what they can do to protect natural resources.
- Engaging kids in conservation education programs such as “Creek Freaks” water monitoring training for streams and rivers, litter clean-ups, bird nesting box projects, and more.
- Utilizing technology and social media such as Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram to draw younger generations to our mission and activities.
- Offering chapter facilities to youth groups such as the Boy Scouts, the Girl Scouts, and 4-H clubs throughout the nation to enhance their conservation and outdoor recreation experiences.
- Supporting young adults who have conservation career ambitions with League-supported scholarships and leadership opportunities.

## Our Impact Is Both Local and National

Here are some of our 2016 highlights from around the country.

### Protecting Streams and Waterways

**Nationally** – In April 2016, the League released a national “report card” detailing how little information is available about water quality in streams across the country. In addition to identifying the problem, the League highlighted how volunteer stream monitors can help close this information gap. The League also launched the *Aqua Bug* mobile app (available free for Apple and Android devices) to help volunteers determine the health of their local rivers and streams.

**Locally** – The League’s *Creek Freaks* and *Save Our Streams* programs provided training and education to hundreds of kids and adult volunteers to monitor local streams and waterways, empowering citizens to mobilize around clean water solutions in their communities around the country.

### Promoting Outdoor Recreation

**Nationally** – The League worked with a broad coalition of state agencies, firearms and archery industry representatives, and other conservation groups to develop a national plan to recruit, retain, and reengage hunters and recreational target shooters. The *National Hunting and Shooting Sports Action Plan* outlines strategies to recruit participants from new demographics (i.e., women and diverse populations), retain participants’ engagement over time, and reactivate lapsed hunters and recreational shooters back into the sport.



**Locally** – The League believes that hunting in America is more than a hobby or family pastime – it’s a critical part of a conservation model that works. Chapters throughout the country promote safe and ethical hunting for adults and youth. In addition, 120 of our nationwide chapters feature shooting ranges and offer responsible firearms training for all ages.

The Ohio Division offers youth hunter training courses and pheasant hunts on chapter property.

### Leading Conservation Initiatives

**Nationally** – League members successfully advocated for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to protect and restore an area in the Kankakee River Basin that had once been known as the “Everglades of the North.” The *Kankakee National Wildlife Refuge and Conservation Area* will conserve wildlife habitat and support many outdoor recreation activities.

**Locally** – Honey bees, monarch butterflies, and other essential pollinators are in steep decline due to the loss of critical habitat. Chapters across the country are working to reverse this trend by restoring and creating habitat on chapter property and in their communities.
