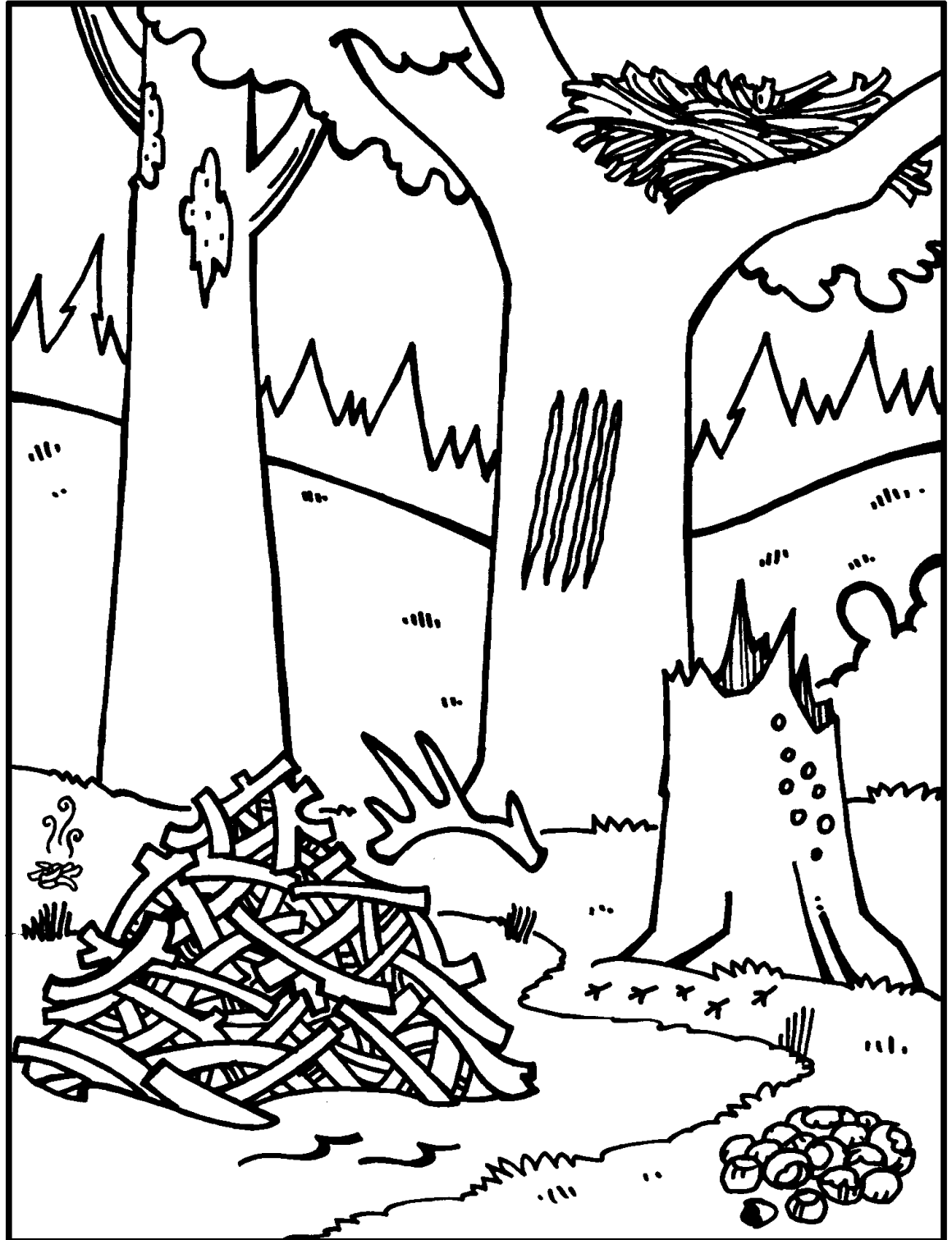

ANSWERS: Bears claw trees to sharpen their claws before a hunt. Beavers build lodges in the water. Deer shed antlers each year and grow new ones. Eagles nest in trees to raise their young. Porcupines are herbivores and eat the bark off tasty trees. Raccoons eat and later leave behind an obvious animal sign. Sandpipers hunt for food at the water's edge. Squirrels love nuts! Woodpeckers bore for insects under the bark of dead or dying trees.
