OUR LOCAL HISTORY

For more than eight decades, the **Jamestown Chapter of the Izaak Walton League** has worked to protect the natural resources of Jamestown and Virginia's tidewater region.

OUR MISSION

To conserve, maintain, protect and restore the soil, forest, water, and other natural resources of the United States and other lands; to promote means and opportunities for the education of public with respect to such resources and their enjoyment and wholesome utilization.

WHO WE ARE

As like-minded conservationists—anglers, hunters, and nature lovers of all walks of life—we work locally to promote our conservation mission.

OUR INTERESTS

Our chapter's primary interests are focused on local clean water issues, including watershed and wetlands protection. We advocate sustainable living and encourage outdoor users to protect our valuable natural resources while they continue to enjoy the great outdoors.

OUR PROGRAMS

We monitor the water quality and health of several area streams using the Izaak Walton League's **Save Our Streams** protocol in conjunction with the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation. On our chapter grounds and as part of the Commonwealth's Department of Forestry Forest Stewardship Program, we manage a 15-acre **Southeastern Forest Arboretum** that is open for field trips to schools and youth groups wishing to learn about nature.

OUR ACTIVITIES

Our chapter is an active participant in our community's "**Annual Canoe Regatta**" to clean the James River. We are supporters of Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries' efforts to promote outdoor education. We host the annual "**Pocahontas Was An Outdoor Woman**" training course to introduce outdoor skills to women of all ages. We also hold several hunter education courses, as well as boater education seminars.

OUR MEETINGS

Our monthly membership meetings are held on the first Sunday at 1:00 P.M. at our chapter's John Smith Memorial Chapter House located in historic Jamestown, Virginia.

OUR EVENTS

Like our meetings, our events are a great place to meet our members and often feature various special guest speakers on topics of outdoor recreation and conservation issues.

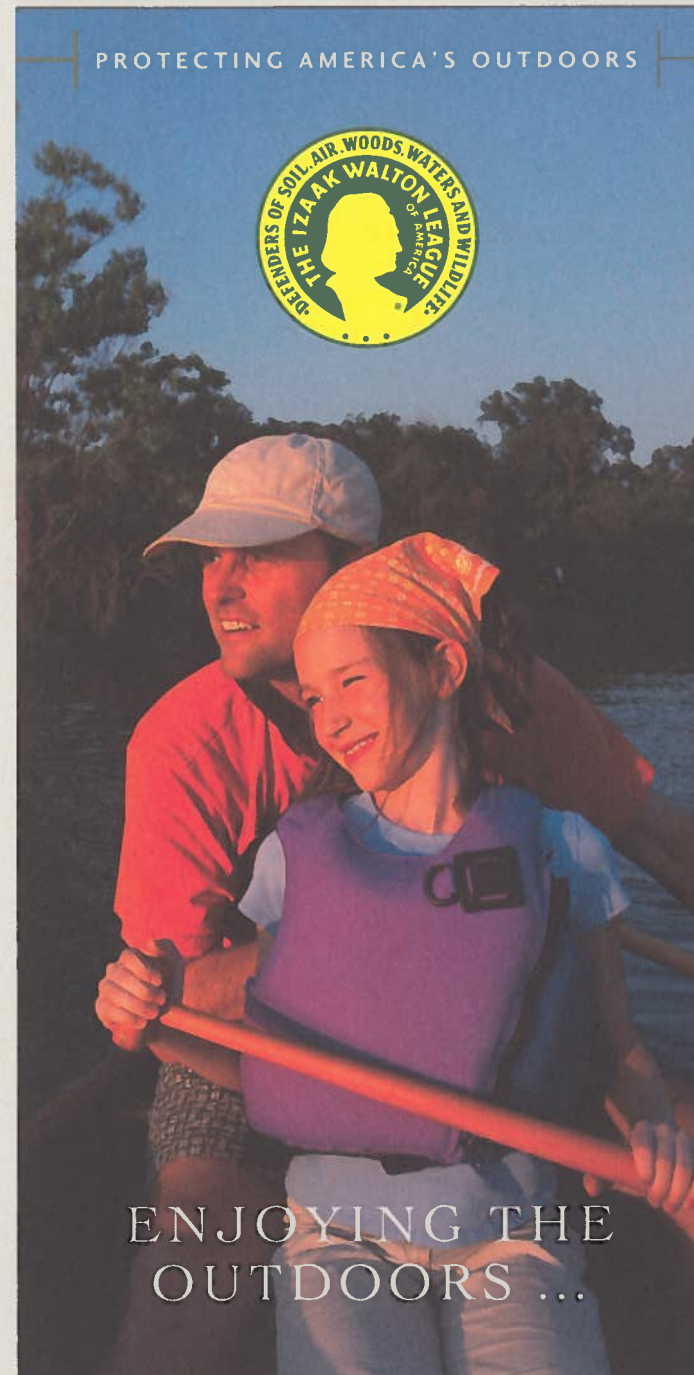
