Nearly half of the Izaak Walton League's 250 chapters operate firearms or archery facilities that are used for recreational shooting, to provide hunter education training, and to safely introduce people to shooting sports.

Recognizing the importance of shooting sports to our chapters, the League is devoting more staff time and financial resources in 2012 to promoting shooting sports and hunting. Our plans for this year include to:
